# Finally the Autumn 2023 edition of the Sopley/Ripley Newsletter has arrived!



It has been an interesting 4 years since the last Newsletter in 2019 but here we are with our Autumn 2023 Edition. A new

concept but firstly I would like to say thank you to all the contributors who have sent, emailed and posted their articles to me to put this together for our local Community.

Sopley Parish Council have been able to help with funding for local projects in the last few years; Sopley School were granted funds for laptops for the children to use at home during the Covid pandemic, Heatherstone Grange Green Group and their projects including the purchase of an infant swing, public benches, Jubilee Orchard and most recently the addition of the Coronation Bench not forgetting their own contribution of funds raised by residents themselves. Grants have also been received from Hampshire County Cllr Michael Thierry and been received from District Cllr Tony Ring for bulbs to be planted at Shirley Common by local Scouts. Sopley Parish Council have also made a substantial donation to the Stepping Stones Nursery. They are also looking at funding for Sopley School Parent/Teacher Association for their new project "Sopley's Secret Garden". This is scheduled for when the Grant funding window opens again in October 2023. Sopley Parish Council have also assisted Sopley Parish Hall in the purchase of a Jubilee Bench and contributed to the installation of a defibrillator at the Parish Hall and also a second defibrillator funded by a parishioner at Heatherstone Grange. Thank you.

Sopley Parish Council have also purchased a Speed Indicator Device to help traffic calming and will be collecting data from various positions in the Parish. If anyone is interested in joining the Speedwatch scheme then please complete the application form on our website or complete the "Contact Form" at www.sopley.gov.uk.

The Cemetery maintenance team have done an amazing job of bringing the local Cemetery back into line after being neglected during Covid 19. Major renovations have been carried out to the cemetery walls to prevent further deterioration. The Lychgate has now also been repaired after damage was caused by a storm in November 2022. The Allotments at Heatherstone Grange have been maintained and there are ongoing projects due to start shortly for hedge, tree and overgrown car park issues. We are currently looking for contractors for these projects so please email if you would like to tender for these opportunities.

Finally, with some great news; Sopley PC have been granted the rights from the Cabinet Office, in honour of the Kings Coronation. The "unnamed" bridge outside the Woolpack Public House will now be known as "Coronation Bridge". Further details regarding signage and a naming date will follow shortly.....



#### Sopley Parish Hall Annual Report – 2023



Welcome at last to an update on the Parish Hall and how the local community is making use of the excellent facilities we are now able to provide!

Covid was a difficult time for us all of course, and we as a committee were concerned about the financial outlook for the Hall, but with the welcome support of two government grants I'm pleased to say we were able to weather the storm and are now once again home to a broad variety of regular user groups, clubs and classes, details of which are listed below.

We have also hosted a great number of private events in recent months – from children's parties, baby showers and christenings, to anniversary celebrations, wedding vow renewals, wakes and various other extended family get-togethers. The staffed licensed bar has been in demand for many of these events, and occasionally the skittle alley too! Meanwhile, our facilities are becoming increasingly popular for workshops and seminars, thanks to both the well-equipped kitchen and the projection equipment which we are able to offer.

After a somewhat hesitant start, with people understandably cautious to start socialising again after lockdown, we have held many of our usual fund-raising events for the local community. Activities that have been widely enjoyed include Skittles, Quizzes, Bingo, Table-top sales and a Christmas buffet with live music. We aim to put these events on about once a month throughout the year; and if you have an idea for one or would perhaps like to get involved in helping to organise them, then please get in touch, we would be delighted to hear from you. In addition to these monthly activities, we are excited to be holding a Village Fete this year – our first event of this kind since Sopley Festival last took place in 2019.

Thanks to Dee Dunn who very kindly let us use her beautiful garden on two occasions for a very English bring-your-own picnic celebration: firstly for the Jubilee and then again for the Coronation, with cakes prepared by Sopley Village W I-a very enjoyable afternoon on both occasions. Dee's garden was also used for a local cycling club AGM and BBQ supper, which was a very successful fund-raising event. Thank you again Dee.

Our thanks go too, as always, to Sopley Parish Council for their ongoing support, in particular their help in raising the funds necessary to complete the Hall restoration and rebuilding project.

#### So where exactly do all these funds go?

Well, the Hall requires regular maintenance and cleaning, and there always seems to be something which needs repairing, replacing, repainting, or just updating to conform with current legislation! During the first week of April for example, the lovely original wooden floor of the main hall, which has done great service for very many years, was sanded and re-varnished: this was quite a major undertaking both in terms of time and outlay but very much due and, now complete, should help keep the floor in good condition for many more years to come.



The Hall is managed by a committee of trustees and other volunteers. New faces are always welcome, especially, dare I say it, those in the younger age bracket! No specific skills are required (though we are more than happy to exploit any that you may have) – just enthusiasm and a willingness to get involved, and of course it's a great way to meet new people. Please contact myself or any other committee member for more details.

We have such a good community facility in the Hall: please help us to keep it running for future generations of inhabitants of the Parish of Sopley (which includes Heatherstone Grange, Avon, Ripley and Shirley).



#### Dee

#### **Avon Tyrrell Estate**

So much has happened since I last wrote in 2019 that I will just concentrate on the highlights.

The rebuild of 37 Ripley was **completed** in 2020 and the rebuild of Bumblebee Cottage also in Ripley- a victim of a number of floods in the past - is now also complete. Like 21 Ripley it has had to be raised up in order to stay dry. A new building for the pig enterprise at Avon Farm was completed in 2019.

Despite last year's very dry summer our hedge planting alongside Solway's Spinney (Footpath 12) only suffered a few losses which have been made good. The previous year's hedge planting from Primrose Lane to (almost) Derritt Lane is growing well with only a few plants having to be replaced. As before we have planted native species mainly quickthorn but also plants such as spindleberry and field maple.

The new plantation from Curry Pond Bridge across to Martins Lane is now looking well established and will make an attractive and nature friendly addition to the landscape. Lord's Piece (off Pitt House Lane) has been felled and replanted with cricket bat willows.

Corner Barn at Court Farm is undergoing extensive repairs which, when complete, will be available to rent as small office units.

Despite having taken over just before the pandemic the New Queen is thriving under Merle and his team led by Martin and Kamil. This year the addition of a pizza oven in the garden will be an added attraction.

We have re routed the stream where it crosses Martins Lane into Anji Hill's field which has successfully stopped the worst of the regular winter flooding of that part of a very popular footpath.

On the people front John Bovett retired as farm manager having joined us in 1999. Sadly Mrs Wonham, who along with her husband Bob came to live on the Estate in 1966, passed away this Spring at 97. Sadly Derek Stainer who farmed Blackberry Farm has also died aged 84 having moved there with his parents when he was just 2 years old.

Finally no round up of Estate news would be complete without a mention of Vernon Dene. Readers may recall that the developers arrived over Easter 2019, demolished all the buildings and cut down all the trees and hedging breaking the electricity power line in the process. All this despite the fact that approximately 40% of the site lies within the Environmental Impact Zone of the three surrounding Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs). Since then numerous concrete pads and access roads have been laid in preparation for the permanent siting for all year round occupation of approximately 90 static homes. Following a direction by the Secretary of State that the works required an Environmental Impact Assessment and a Habitats Regulation Assessment the National Park served an Enforcement Notice requiring the removal of the unauthorised works. The site has changed hands again and the US controlled developer has appealed the Enforcement Notice and applied for planning permission. Although no permit has been granted by the Environment Agency as far as we know the developers still intend to discharge the so called treated sewage into the ditch that runs across the Blackberry Farm SSSI, into the Ripley Brook and then the River Avon.

Vernon Dene is surrounded by three SSSI s which are home to a number of rare and sensitive plants and animals including Nightjars, Smooth Snakes and Sand Lizards.

We expect a hearing before a Planning Inspector towards the end of this year.

Local organisations and charities promoted their activities and raised funds. A variety of foods were on offer and refreshment was provided by a beer tent run by The Carpenter's Arms. A big thank you to all those taking part.

In June, our **Annual Fun Run** took place with 5k and 10k events. Our top times included the first place runner completing the 5km route in 18.37 minutes and 10km first place in 36.17 minutes.

This summer we are again teaming up with Folksy Theatre and Harrow Wood Farm Caravan Park to bring you The Merry Wives of Windsor by William Shakespeare. The event takes place on Sunday 6th August so by the time you read this newsletter it will already have happened. However, the audience is invited to bring a picnic to enjoy before the performance. If last year is anything to go by, everyone will have really enjoyed what we hope will become a summer staple.

Socially we have had a wine tasting, monthly rambles through different parts of the Forest, and we've had a very enjoyable safari supper. More outings are planned over the next year.

We have launched our new look website! Not only does this tell you more about us, but tickets for our events can now be purchased on line.


#### FRIENDS OF SOPLEY CHURCH

# Bransgore Community First Responders Appeal for volunteers in Bransgore, Burley and Sopley areas.

Community First Responders are members of the public, just like you and I, trained and despatched by the ambulance service to attend local medical emergencies to provide basic life support until the arrival of the ambulance. We need more members to help

provide our service. Having more volunteers in these areas means we can achieve a faster response time to greatly improve patient care and survival rates in the critical minutes before the arrival of the ambulance.

We really hope people have been motivated by what they have seen and experienced over the past three years and will want to help to make a difference in their community. Being an ambulance community first responder is a great way of putting something back into your community.



You must be over 18 with use of a car, be of good character and fit enough to carry the equipment bag up a flight of stairs to assist a patient. No previous medical experience is necessary, all training and uniform is provided by the ambulance service over two weekends. Our team support new volunteers.

We ask for a minimum of 20 hours on-call every month in case needed, at times that suit the individual. You are not knowingly sent to the type of call that may place you at any risk. This is extremely rewarding work -probably the most rewarding work on dry land. You won't be paid - other than out of pocket expenses- but the reward is having the knowledge that by supporting our NHS ambulance service you will have helped save lives in your community, and there is no greater satisfaction than that.

2021 had seen the installation of a child swing, benches, and picnic tables around the SANG (green areas) for the benefit of residents and walkers. (Main funding by Sopley PC with support from residents).

2022 was a busy year for HG Green Group, well supported by its residents (and their children).

Hedge & Orchard - January 2022, saw initial ground work and hole digging by NFDC, with residents' and their children planting a mixed hedge, supplied by the Woodland Trust. This was quickly followed by the planting of an orchard - 11 trees (apple, cherry, plum and pear). Sopley Parish Council, and residents provided funding.

We hope the hedge will encourage more birds, whilst the orchard the production of more homemade fruit pies!

Spring bulbs - November saw an enthusiastic group of residents' fund and plant Spring bulbs. 1,500 daffs in 5 locations around the green walkways and 1,250 crocuses around the large oak tree on the main green.

#### A CORONATION 1953 STYLE

Memories from 1953 will be recalled again this year by many older people due to the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II in September last year.

The heir to the throne's Coronation has been planned for this coming May, so I am sure plans will have been made to organise celebrations around our Parish by various groups, which most likely will include the Parish Council, the Parish Hall Committee, the Parish Church, the Primary School and many individuals.

Back in mid-January 1953, the Parish Council under the stewardship of the Right Hon The Lord Manners, H.A.Kemp-Welch Esq. Messrs .T.L.Dampney, A. Lane, F.Tuck, and A.E.Wiseman, formed a Coronation Committee to organise a programme of events for the residents of the Parish.

According to their printed schedule the main event was to be a Sports Day for children and adults, to include a buffet tea, music and a bonfire. Other occasions planned were a coach drive for Old Age Pensioners (sic) on a subsequent day, some small permanent souvenir for children and the flood-lighting of Sopley Church.

Donations were invited from parishioners and an authorised collector was to be sent round the villages to collect these, which raised a total of £78-9s-8d. Residents were also asked to make a special effort to have houses and gardens "bright and festive" during the celebrations.

Other donations to help with the cost were received from two village Whist Drives, a Dance at Sopley Social Club and a separate Social Evening, all raising an amount of £26-3s-0d. The R.A.F. at Sopley gave £7-7s-0d, the Jocktrill Committee gave £5-0s-0d, Sopley British Legion gave £7-0s-0d and Mr and Mrs E. Stuart, who ran the Sopley Stores raised another £1-0s-0d through returned Brooke Bond tea wrappers, ( a scheme running at that time ). Hampshire County Council also made a grant of £6-4s-0d.

The Sports events and Fancy Dress parade were held in the field by Ripley School, opposite Ripley triangle, by kind permission of the farmer, Mr Lot Hunt. For this special occasion a Grand Raffle was organised, for a prize of a Ladies Bicycle, supplied by Mr A J Harrison, Motor and Cycle Engineer of Sopley, at a cost of £8-5s-0d. Tickets for this were one shilling and £28-11s-0d was raised.

It was decided to purchase 150 Bibles and special bookplates for the Children's Coronation Souvenir, which was supplied through Canon Kirkham at a cost of £38-0s-0d.

More than twenty races were held during the Sports Day afternoon, separate ones for girls and boys and also mixed ones of different distances. These included flat races, three legged races, sack races, relay races, egg and spoon race, high jump, obstacle race and wheelbarrow races.

For adults there was a ladies novelty and relay race, whilst the men had a novelty race, and a veterans handicap race, which was for men over 35 years of age. This race was over 100yds and you gained an extra yard per year, if you were over thirty five.

Besides these a Tilting the Bucket, Greasy Pole, slow bicycle race and a Tug of War were organised, with the latter being competed for by teams from the villages of Avon, Shirley, Ripley and Sopley. No record has been found of the winner of this no doubt hotly contested event.

A buffet tea was available between 4-30pm and 6pm, but you were advised to bring your own cup and saucer.

Music during the afternoon and evening was provided and relayed by the Public Address System kindly loaned by the R.A.F. at Sopley. With the Queen's Speech being

relayed at 9pm, it is believed that the bonfire was the conclusion to the day's activities.

Later in the year, the accounts for the events and activities associated with Parish celebrations the gave interesting view of monies gathered and spent. One entry showed that from the generous amounts received, the Parish was able to send £5-0s-0d to the Westminster Abbey Appeal Fund. This charity is still active today and helps with costs for repairs and maintenance of the Abbey, along with Choir supporting the School, training education, religious and activities.


Information for this article was taken from the Charity Commission website and documents donated to me from
